## Small Entity Compliance Guide

Dear Scallop Permit Holder:

This letter is to inform you that the 2009 Observer Set-aside total allowable catch (TAC) for the Elephant Trunk Access Area (ETAA) has been fully utilized. Therefore, for any ETAA scallop trip departing after 0001 hours May 5, 2009, and with an observer on board, the vessel may not land additional scallops to offset the cost of that observer. Scallop vessels that have been selected to take an observer and cross the demarcation line before 0001, May 5, 2009, may complete their trips and land up to an additional 400 lb for each day at sea the observer is on board.

You must still comply with all the observer notification requirements, and owners will be responsible for paying the cost of observers, if selected to carry observers in the ETAA. The Atlantic sea scallop regulations at 50 CFR 648.60(d)(2) state that vessel owners are responsible for paying the cost of observers, regardless of whether the vessel lands or sells scallops on that trip, and regardless of the availability of set-aside for an increased possession limit. Vessels may not depart on a scallop trip in the ETAA without an observer if the vessel owner, operator, and/or manager has not received a waiver of the observer requirement.
